

Downtown Revitalization



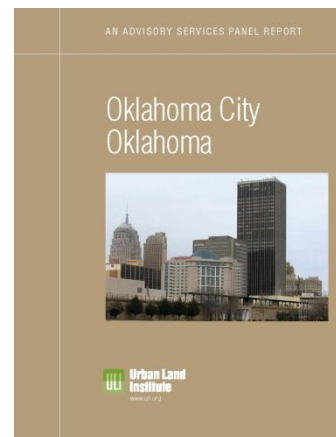

Today, panels offer 60 years of experience and the collective professional experiences of ULI's membership. Panels assist cities large and small to attract diverse residents and new development to downtown. Effective downtown revitalization requires market-supported economic development, engaged developers, innovative urban design, and consistent implementation.

Recent panels explored the redevelopment of industrial land near Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, the redevelopment of the Revere School District in Chicago, Illinois and the redevelopment of a historically African-American community near Uptown Charlotte, North Carolina.
