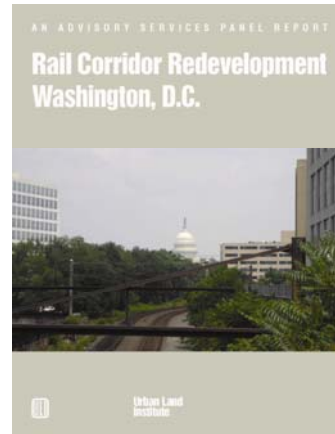
Working to integrate infrastructure and land use?

The stimulus acts offer unprecedented opportunities to achieve sustainability and prosperity. As this complicated investment process unfolds, communities will need to ensure that “shovel ready” projects are contributing to the long term sustainability and economic viability of the nation.

Smart communities will build infrastructure that supports sustainable land use and advances health, prosperity, and global competitiveness. Communities must think holistically to:

- > Integrate land use and infrastructure to reduce Vehicle Miles Travelled (VMT)
- > Leverage existing infrastructure
- > Balance infrastructure investments to include both new growth and infill areas

ULI Advisory Services panels help communities integrate land use and infrastructure. For more than 60 years, ULI has advised governments, non-profits, and developers on land use issues. Infrastructure--transportation, utilities, and communication--is integral to the panel process.
