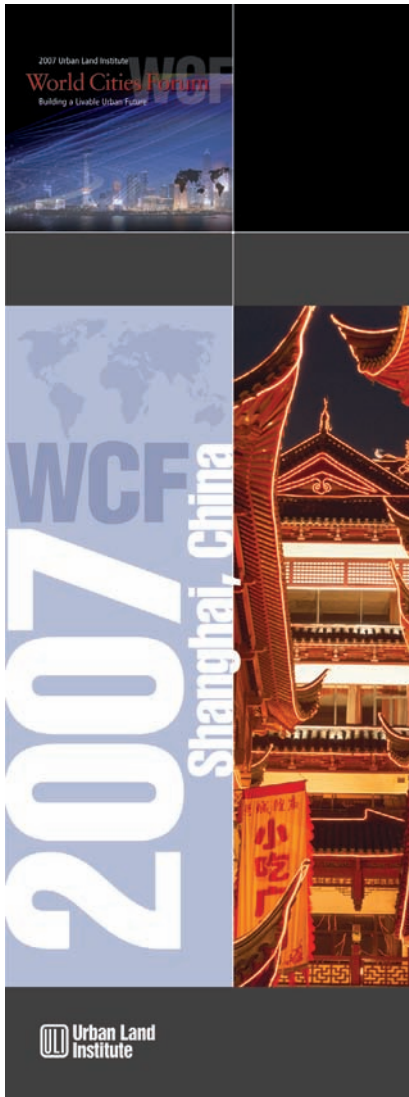

Mobile Workshops

ULI has organized five real estate-oriented mobile workshops. Monday's mobile workshops will focus on two of the 16 unique "new towns" being developed around Shanghai proper. Tuesday's mobile workshops will take place in Shanghai proper and will give attendees a quick snapshot of some of the cutting-edge development occurring in the city.

Shanghai Deep Port and Lingang New Town

The Shanghai Deep Port includes a 52-berth container terminal located on a cluster of partially inhabited islands in Hangzhou Bay south of Shanghai. A 32 kilometre bridge connects the islands to the closest onshore point, the new town port city of Lingang. The inspiration for Lingang comes from a mixture of famous port cities around the world. Environmentally conscious, information-oriented, and with a developed port industry, Lingang new town boasts all the necessities that a future city should have. The city was designed by GMP, an international design corporation from Germany, and is divided into five districts, each with a different industry focus.

Xintiandi and Daning Mixed-Use Developments

Explore two of Shanghai's most innovative mixed-use developments: Xintiandi and Daning.

Xintiandi, the first development in the Taipinggiao Redevelopment Project, is an urban tourist attraction imbued with the city's historical and cultural legacies. Located at the City Centre of Shanghai, Shanghai Xintiandi features several Shikumen houses—a special form of old building architecture found only in Shanghai—as well as state-of-the-art new buildings. With this unique architectural design, Xintiandi won the 2003 ULI Award for Excellence.

The Life Hub @ Daning is a project undertaken by Chongbang Development, a joint venture company. The Life Hub @ Daning provides more than 213,000 square metres of retail, office, and residential uses. The project is the first of its kind in Shanghai and creates for the city's mainstream consumers a convenient, trendy, comfortable, and affordable place to live, work, and play.

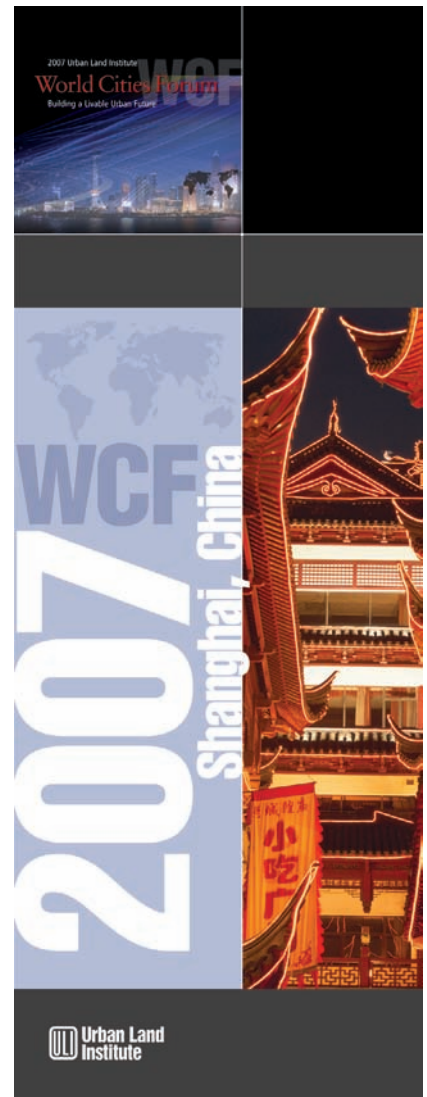

Shanghai Old and New: Puxi, The Bund, and Pudong

Shanghai is a city of great contrasts, perhaps best revealed in the planning and architectural character of the city. Take a walk through time by exploring traditional Chinese Shikumen-style houses and the later European neoclassical influences of commercial buildings situated along the Bund. From Puxi, head across the Huangpu River to Pudong, which has emerged in the past 15 years as a world example of modern architecture and design. This workshop will be led by architectural and urban design experts who will explain how the city literally is transforming itself at almost unimaginable speed. Comfortable walking shoes recommended.
